History of Flag Day - Tuesday, June 14th

The first known celebration of Flag Day happened in 1885 when school teacher Bernard Cigrand organized a celebration with his students at Stony Hill School. Cigrand was a great advocate for patriotism and respect for the flag and lobbied with the United States Congress for the creation of an annual Flag Day celebration on June 14. In 1886, Cigrand wrote an article for the Chicago Argus that proposed the establishment of an annual observance of the American flag's birthday. He is credited by many as being the Father of Flag Day.

Officially, it was in 1916 that President Woodrow Wilson proclaimed June 14 as Flag Day, to be observed every year. Every year, the President in office should call on government officials and U.S. citizens to display the American flags outside buildings and their homes.

Father's Day - Sunday, June 19th

It is thought that Father's Day origins lie in a service held at a West Virginia church on July 5, 1908, where the Sunday sermon was exclusively dedicated to fathers in honor of the men who had lost their lives in a mine explosion in Monongah. This was, however, a one-time celebration without any intention of making it an annual observance.

June was deemed more appropriate for the observance of Father's Day. On June 19, 1910, the first official Father's Day was celebrated in the state of Washington. Quite a few Presidents tried to make Father's Day an official holiday in the national holiday, starting with Woodrow Wilson in 1916, however, they were repeatedly shut down by Congress. It was in 1966 that President Lyndon B. Johnson issued a proclamation declaring the third Sunday of June as Father's Day. The day was only made into a national holiday in 1972, by the hand of President Richard Nixon.

Father's Day is the perfect occasion to commemorate fathers or any father figures in people's lives. Many people give their fathers cards or gifts or take them out to dinner. Those who live close to their dads pay them a visit and spend the day doing nice activities together.

World Environment Day - Sunday, June 5th

Things you can do on World Environment Day - Recycling is the easiest way you can help in helping the environment. It's something most households and people around the world already do, and it's as simple as separating normal trash, plastic, paper, and glass and putting them in their specific bins. However, it's not enough to do this at home. When you are out and about, you should be aware of your recyclables or any recyclable you may find laying around, and find recycling bin instead of putting it all in one common bin. You may even have to take it to your home to recycle if no receptacle is present, it's a small act of conservation that will impact in a great way! Wednesday, June 8th is World Oceans Day

World Oceans Day - Wednesday, June 8th

How to make an impact on World Oceans Day - One of the best and easiest actions to take during World Oceans Day is to organize or participate in a beach clean up initiative. One of the biggest current threats to the ocean is the amount of plastic that is disposed of everywhere, including the litter that people leave on the beach. It is estimated that 13 million tons of plastic goes into the ocean every year, killing 100 thousand marine life as a consequence. This can easily translate to our lakes, rivers, and streams here in Michigan. When you see trash while you are recreating, pick it up and dispose of it properly! Our lakes, rivers, and streams are important eco systems that need our care and conservation.

Hello All,

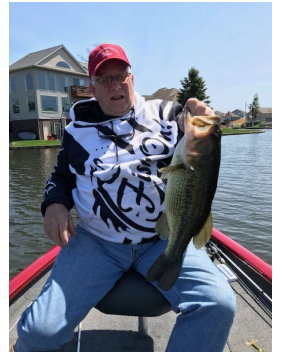
Well the 70 and 80 degree weather is finally here! It won't be too long before everyone starts to complain about it being too hot!

We are always looking for names/addresses of deployed military. We will send them boxes monthly at no charge to them! This is what we do! Contact office@desertangel.org

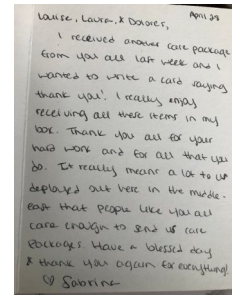

2022 SUMMER OUTDOOR BOWLING PIN SHOOTING DATES

First Saturday of the month
June 4, July 2, August 6, September 3

Starts at 10 AM and Stops at 2 PM
Center-Fire and Rim-Fire

FOR BOWLING PINS, bring a pistol, PCC or revolver, a magazine, ammunition, eye and ear protection.
Optional: water, sunscreen and hat.

Calibers are limited to 22lr, 32acp, 380acp, 38 special, 9mm, 40cal and 45acp. Sorry no magnums, no 10mm and no bottleneck cartridges. All firearms are bagged or boxed, we will not be shooting from holsters.

The setup consists of two tables of pins, with a long bench for the shooters, allowing for social distancing. You typically shoot 6-tables per set, with one or two shooters on the line at a time. Shooters will be setting their own pins, so you may choose to wear gloves.

Targets consist of either full bowling pins, or the bottom halves left from using the top-halves used for the 22cal indoor shoots. These bottom halves work well with 9mm or smaller calibers. Action pistol bays are located next to the Waterford Hills racetrack between the rifle range and shotgun range.

We are shooting on the same schedule as the Steel Plate Shoots, giving you more opportunities to shoot on these days. Bring a friend! \$5.00 for members and \$10.00 for non-members *for the day*.

Conservation Corner/Michigan United Conservation Clubs

Conservation for a cause....We all know about Pat Larsen and his drive to help the Michigan Fallen Hero's Foundation . Dan Valentini came up with a fun idea to help out while Pat was wintering down south. Over the past few months several of the sub clubs put \$25 dollars in a pot and have been collecting aluminum for a winner takes all contest. I am very proud to say that OCSC collected over 700 pounds of aluminum!!!! The winners.....Shot Gun.....Congratulations!!! Even better.....Dan and his group DONATED the prize to Michigan Fallen Heroes Foundation!!! Thanks to local recycling group “Scrap Dog” who loaned us a box truck and scale and paid a very generous amount for our collection.

Club member Rick Goodrich was kind enough to volunteer his time on May 7th to help with the Adopt a Stream spring river monitoring. A great abundance of aquatic bug larva was found. We also conducted a Salt Watch sponsored by the Izaak Walton League of America and the Clinton River Watershed Council. This test measures the effects of winter road salts and other deicers on river quality. Our piece of the Clinton River Chloride count has remained very stable at around 127ppm (Parts Per Million). The full report will be posted on our website when it becomes available.
