Although this program is open to all youth, OCSC members will be signed up first. A mandatory safety class will be held this night for the "Newbie" and their parent.

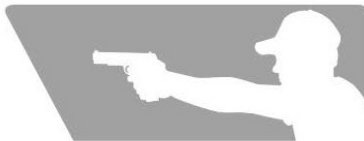

2022 SUMMER OUTDOOR BOWLING PIN SHOOTING DATES

First Saturday of the month, Last one is on September 3

Starts at 10 AM and Stops at 2 PM (Center-Fire and Rim-Fire)

FOR BOWLNG PINS, bring a pistol, PCC or revolver, a magazine, ammunition, eye and ear protection.
Optional: water, sunscreen and hat.

Calibers are limited to 22lr, 32acp, 380acp, 38 special, 9mm, 40cal and 45acp. Sorry no magnums, no 10mm and no bottleneck cartridges. All firearms are bagged or boxed, we will not be shooting from holsters.

The setup consists of two tables of pins, with a long bench for the shooters, allowing for social distancing. You typically shoot 6-tables per set, with one or two shooters on the line at a time. Shooters will be setting their own pins, so you may choose to wear gloves.

Targets consist of either full bowling pins, or the bottom halves left from using the top-halves used for the 22cal indoor shoots. These bottoms halves work well with 9mm or smaller calibers. Action pistol bays are located next to the Waterford Hills racetrack between the rifle range and shotgun range.

We are shooting on the same schedule as the Steel Plate Shoots, giving you more opportunities to shoot on these days. Bring a friend! \$5.00 for members and \$10.00 for non-members *for the day*.

We hope you will consider attending an Oakland County Sport Fishing Club meeting and join the fun!

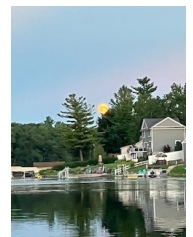
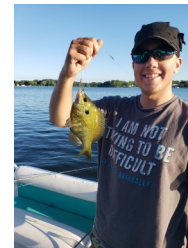
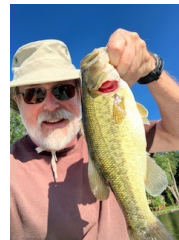
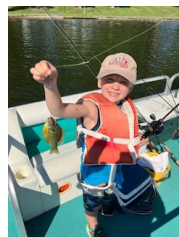

Hexavalent what?!?!?

There has been a quite a bit of troubling environmental news in our area lately. The most recent of which is a spill of Hexavalent Chromium into the Huron River near Wixom. A manufacturing plant reported the spill and the Michigan DNR has been testing the affected waters. There currently is a “No Contact” advisory for the Huron River between north Wixom road and Kensington road. Amounts detected have been small and the recent rains have helped to dilute out the toxin. Hexavalent chromium is a known cancer causing agent that was used in manufacturing processes such as metal plating, leather tanning and as a wood preservative. How the spill happened and exactly how much spilled is still being investigate.

This hexavalent chromium spill and the recent years news of PFAS (per and poly fluorinated substances) also being found in Michigan waters has had a very troubling effect on many outdoor activities. We must all do our part to help find and report such events. Some clues to look for are: Foam floating on water, plant and fish die offs, unusual color or smell of a lake or stream. When you see something like this please contact Oakland County 24 hour hotline (248-858-0931), EGLE (1.800.662.9278), The Clinton River Watershed Counsel (248.601.0606), or any local authority (Fire, Police etc). You can also help by cleaning out your home and garage of hazardous substances. There are several “No-Haz” Collection events where you can drop off old paint, solvents, fuels etc.. Contact wrm@d.oakgov.com for a list of upcoming events.

Each match will have 5 courses of fire (stages) with an average round count of 125. Each stage will present the shooter with challenge in which they can determine the best way to shoot the available targets.

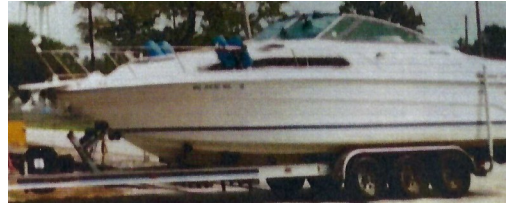
