


We are revving up to start selling tickets for the Mystery Safe, which will be drawn at the last general membership meeting of the year, December 28, 2022.



Typically, people move back to indoor routines after Labor Day. We've heard several comments from customers that they didn't realize the fish fry was still open since they didn't see the ad in the

paper. The signs and cones aren't always put up on Fridays anymore, so someone driving by might think it isn't going on. We've also had new customers almost every week, as well as some mentioning they are finally feeling comfortable about coming out after COVID.
