Hunting, fishing in Michigan!

Opossum, porcupine, weasel, red squirrel, skunk, ground squirrel, woodchuck, Russian boar, feral pigeons, starling and house sparrows

Cottontail rabbit and snowshoe hare through March 31. Squirrel hunting (both fox and gray) through March 31. Crow hunting open through March 31.

Late goose season in the **South Zone** is open through Feb. 8. In the Allegan County Goose Management Unit, the late goose season is open through Feb. 14. The 2020 Waterfowl Digest, available at Michigan.gov/Waterfowl, has season dates, regulations, bag limits and additional waterfowl hunting details.

Fishing for Bluegill, perch, walleye, northern pike, and crappie are all popular fish species during Michigan's Winter season and are sure to hold you over until the ice melts away in the Spring. In Michigan, you have about 4-5 months of cold winter weather where the lakes freeze over enough to get some quality ice fishing in. Provided there is ice!!!!

Coyote hunting is open year-round; trapping is open through March 1. Raccoon trapping is open through March 31.

Fox (red and gray) hunting and trapping seasons are open through March 1. Trapping opportunities are also available for badger, beaver, muskrat, mink and otter. See the Fur Harvester Digest for season dates and bag limits. Find additional information on fur harvesting regulations, bag limits and seasons

in the 2020 Fur Harvester Digest, available at Michigan.gov/Trapping.

Range Safety Committee

IMPORTANT----- PLEASE READ

We have had somebody firing unauthorized rounds in the Indoor Range. This has to stop now. The **ONLY** rifles that are allowed on the Indoor Range are rifles that shoot a rimfire .22 caliber or rifles that shoot a <u>pistol caliber</u> 9mm

cartridge, commonly called a Pistol Caliber Carbine. <u>AR-15 Platforms</u> that shoot <u>.223</u> <u>or 5.56</u> or any other caliber other than .22 rimfire or 9mm Pistol cartridge are <u>NOT AL-LOWED</u>. Bullets that have a steel core are

NOT ALLOWED. If you see anyone shooting unauthorized rounds in the Indoor Range, please ask them to stop and report it to the Office and/or to Warren Pratt.

Here is a list of **some** specific PISTOL calibers that are not allowed: 10mm, .357 S&W, .357 Sig, 5.7x28 FN or any bottleneck cartridge. The picture shows what someone has been doing to our indoor range.

The Outdoor Range has signs posted everywhere, but yet people still do not follow the rules. The most common

violation is the "Single Load Only" rule on the uncovered stations. This means: you may only put **ONE BULLET** in your gun to shoot at a time. If this is still unclear, please call

anyone on the Range Safety Committee for further clarification. **NO PISTOLS** on the 50 and 100yd uncovered ranges. Shoot only at properly placed paper targets and do not shoot the signs or wooden target holders.

Please be mindful of your muzzle and keep your finger on the slide and off the trigger until you are on target.

Take a moment to reread all range rules. You may get a current copy from the main office.

Please keep our ranges safe.

Remember you are welcome to come to the monthly Archery Club Meeting. The meetings are held on the third Wednesday of the month in the Archery Club Building. We welcome your input!



Got Ice? We had some for a minute then poof, it was gone. As I write this (January 7) there was no ice on Townsend Lake. Our February 18th Ice fishing event may have to be post-poned or cancelled or changed to a beach picnic. Time will tell. Speaking of ice, I found a fairly interesting video showing Great Lakes ice cover over the past few decades on the NOAA (National Oceanographic and Atmospheric Administration) website https://wwww.glerl.noaa.gov/data/ice/historicalAnim/ it looks very cyclical to me.

Meaning Behind the 13 Folds of the Flag



The Flag Itself

The portion of the flag denoting honor is the canton of blue containing the stars representing states our veterans served in uniform. The field of blue dresses from left to right and is inverted only when draped as a funeral cloth over the casket of a veteran who has served our country honorably in uniform. In the U.S. Armed Forces, at the ceremony of retreat, the flag is lowered, folded in a triangle and kept under watch

throughout the night as a tribute to our nation's honored dead. The next morning it is brought out and, at a ceremony of reveille, flown high as a symbol of belief in the resurrection of the body.

Meaning Behind the 13 Folds

The flag-folding ceremony represents the same religious principles on which our great country was originally founded.

The first fold of our flag is a symbol of life.

The second fold is a symbol of our belief in eternal life.

The third fold is made in honor and remembrance of the veteran departing our ranks, and who gave a portion of his or her life for the defense of our country to attain peace throughout the world.

The fourth fold represents our weaker nature; as American citizens trusting in God, it is Him we turn to in times of peace, as well as in times of war, for His divine guidance.

The fifth fold is a tribute to our country. In the words of Stephen Decatur, "Our country, in dealing with other countries, may she always be right, but it is still our country, right or wrong."

The sixth fold is for where our hearts lie. It is with our heart that we pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of America, and to the republic for which it stands, one nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all.

The seventh fold is a tribute to our armed forces, for it is through the armed forces that we protect our country and our flag against all enemies, whether they are found within or without the boundaries of our republic.

The eighth fold is a tribute to the one who entered into the valley of the shadow of death, that we might see the light of day, and to honor our mother, for whom it flies on Mother's Day.

The ninth fold is a tribute to womanhood. It has been through their faith, love, loyalty and devotion that has molded the character of the men and women who have made this country great.

The 10th fold is a tribute to father, who has also given his sons and daughters for the defense of our country since he or she was first born.

The 11th fold represents the lower portion of the seal of King David and King Solomon and glorifies the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob.

The 12th fold represents an emblem of eternity and glorifies God the Father, the Son and Holy Ghost.

The 13th and last fold, when the flag is completely folded, the stars are uppermost, reminding us of our national motto, "In God We Trust."

After the Folding Ceremony

After the flag is completely folded and tucked in, it has the appearance of a cocked hat, ever reminding us of the soldiers who served under Gen. George Washington and the sailors and Marines who served under Capt. John Paul Jones and were followed by their comrades and shipmates in the U.S. Armed Forces, preserving for us the rights, privileges and freedoms we enjoy today.

The source and the date of origin of this Flag Folding Procedure is unknown. However, some sources attribute it to the Gold Star Mothers of America while others to an Air Force chaplain stationed at the United States Air Force Academy. Some sources also indicate that the 13 folds are a nod to the original first 13 colonies. The flag folding ceremony is provided as a patriotic service.

VA Policy on Flag-Folding Recitation of "13-Fold" Ceremony

To ensure burial services at the 143 national cemeteries operated by the Department of Veterans Affairs, reflect the wishes of veterans and their families, the VA officials have clarified the department's policy about recitations made while the U.S. flag is folded at the grave site of a veteran. "Honoring the burial wishes of veterans is one of the highest commitments for the men and women of VA," said the undersecretary for Memorial Affairs. "A family may request the recitation of words to accompany the meaningful presentation of the American flag as we honor the dedication and sacrifice of their loved ones." Traditional grave site military funeral honors include the silent folding and presentation of a U.S. flag, three rifle volleys and the playing of Taps.
