

Muzzleloaders - Clan of the Wolf





Muzzleloading guns are often as different as the people who shoot them, but there are three basic categories: flintlock, caplock and inline. The Oakland County Muzzleloader Club only permits the firing of Flintlock or Caplock style rifles on our muzzleloader range.

Flintlock

Flintlock muzzleloaders look and operate much like those used by Boone and Crockett in the 1800s. They are also often referred to as "black powder" guns because they use flintlocks and black gunpowder to propel patched balls. Flintlock muzzleloaders require more time and effort to shoot than more modern muzzleloaders because of the steps involved in a successful discharge.

With flintlock muzzleloaders, a flint strikes a piece of metal, called a frizzen. The flint scrapes small pieces of hot metal away from the frizzen, which are then deposited into a pan of priming powder that ignite the gunpowder in the barrel of the gun. The process can be difficult because of all the variables involved. The flint has to be the proper size to produce the pieces of metal from the frizzen, the frizzen needs to be hard enough to ignite the priming powder in the pan, and the proper amount of priming powder needs to be used to discharge the gunpowder in the barrel.

There is a special class of flintlock known as a trade gun. These rifles were lower end rifles and used to trade for various goods in the early settler days. They are basically a flintlock with a smooth barrel (no rifling) and no rear sight. Mastering the Trade gun requires much practice but competing with this type of rifle can be very satisfying. Shoots are the Oakland County Sportsmen's Club include a special event for these types of rifles.

There is a misconception that flintlock muzzleloaders can't be effectively used for hunting. But the truth is, flintlock muzzleloaders can be as accurate as modern guns with proper practice. Many traditional muzzleloading enthusiasts are successful at hunting deer and other big-game animals with flintlock guns.

Caplock

With a caplock muzzleloader, a cap is held by a nipple on the side of the gun barrel rather than a piece of flint. After a hammer strikes the cap, the resulting flame travels from the nipple to the barrel of the gun.

Inline

With inline muzzleloaders, the cap is located directly behind the charge. Inline guns allow more of the original flame to access the barrel and ignite the flame. Most inline muzzleloaders also provide more protection for the caps, thus providing more reliability.

Many inline muzzleloaders also feature added features like scopes that are beneficial for hunting but go against the traditional notion of flintlock guns. Inline muzzleloaders also often use powder that is pelletized and bullets that look more like present-day ammunition. Inline muzzleloaders are not allowed to shoot or compete on the designated muzzleloader range but may be shot on the 100-yard range for sight in.

Size Matters

Whether you shoot a flintlock, caplock or inline muzzleloader, there are a variety of ammunition sizes available. The majority of muzzleloaders use about .50-caliber ammunition because it is good for hunting deer and other large game, as well as for leisure and target shooting.

The caliber configuration of a muzzleloader is strictly a matter of preference. Some enthusiasts prefer smaller-caliber guns in the .36- to .40-caliber range, while others prefer guns in the .50- to .54-caliber even .62-caliber for a special class of Flintlock called a trade gun. For hunting purposes, the larger the caliber of the ammunition, the larger the game you can effectively shoot.

Hunting Weapons

Seeing the smoke that they produce and how much bigger and bulkier muzzleloading rifles are than traditional guns might make you think they are more for show than functionality. But with scopes and sights, they can be just as good as high-powered rifles.

The effective distance for muzzleloaders is normally around 150 yards or less, but most hunting is done at much shorter distances. Reloading is obviously more of a challenge, but in hunting you usually only have one shot anyway. Make it count.

Do your best to get the fish in the net and released as quickly as you can.

High Power Rifle Match Practice

The D.R. Wilson Rifle & Pistol Club will be holding High Power Rifle Match Practice starting Tuesday, May 2, 2023 thru Tuesday, August, 29, 2023.

Range Safety Committee

Specific calibers <u>NOT</u> allowed on Indoor Range are .223, .556, 10mm, .357 magnum, .357 Sig, 5.7 x 28. This list is NOT inclusive of all calibers that are NOT allowed.

We have had a lot of problems with members not signing into the ranges properly. The first problem is people are not signing in **legibly** and **printing full names completely**. Please fill in every column including a phone number. Writing "on file" is not acceptable. If you are bringing a guest, **YOU** should sign in for them completely. **YOU** must also fill out the Guest Fee envelope with **date** (the same date you signed in), **printing full names** of member and each guest and amount of money in the envelope. Everyone on the range must be signed in and on a separate line. Do not put M + G in the column where it asks if that person in a Member or Guest. You must use a properly completed Guest Fee Envelope for guest fees. **Do Not Put Loose Money In The Guest Fee Slot.** Do not put a <u>blank</u> envelope with money in it, into the box. Sounds crazy but members do it all the time. It is like putting loose money into the box (see above).

If you are coming into the range and you use your swipe card to unlock the door and someone else comes in behind you, politely ask them to use their own swipe card to unlock the door. Do not let anyone into the range on your card unless they are with you. **You** are responsible for anyone you let into the range.

While we continue to get more flaggers and other volunteers than we have in quite some time, we were, by coincidence, short of stewards, grid, pace car and tech workers all at the same time. The usual volunteers filled in admirably and the weekend went by with few hitches. It should serve as a reminder that our club doesn't run itself. If you believe that the opportunity to race here is worthwhile, you should consider helping out. There was a time not terribly long ago (before transponders), where the only way to have your laps timed was to have either you or a crew member run a stopwatch upstairs for another race group. We do not want to return to mandatory volunteerism-that's an oxymoron!

The new grill Jerry Pintar found for us got a good workout after the last Saturday races. We'll do it again Saturday of race weekend 4. Stay, relax, and enjoy good food, drink and the best company around - your fellow racers and their families. Please bring a dish to pass and a donation to help defray costs.

Next month I look forward to writing about a successful 3 day Vintage weekend and a successful Race 4 Weekend.

Again, I have pretty much decided to close each Sticky Tires with a reminder that we are already members of OCSC and that we owe the club our loyalty and participation.
