What Is Veterans Day?

Veterans Day is held in honor of all military veterans, including both the fallen and the living, who have served in the United States Armed Forces, during wartime or peacetime. While Veterans Day celebrates retired soldiers and victims inclusive of all wars on the same day annually, the date of November 11 was originally designated in 1919 as it coincided with commemorating the end of World War I. Until 1954 when it was replaced, Veterans Day was known as Armistice Day.

Thanksgiving 1789 Proclamation

Thanksgiving is celebrated on the **fourth Thursday of every November** and in 2023, Thanksgiving falls on November 23rd. George Washington, before his presidency, had often proclaimed days of thanks for victories during the Revolutionary War. Now, after the success of the Revolution, he desired his country to be governed by laws that were faithful to the Constitution. In recognition of this, in 1789, he issued a proclamation that Thursday 26, the last Thursday in November, should be Thanksgiving Day, marking the first national observance of the day.

We will have another work weekend on November 18 and 19. We need a lot of help and would like to see some more volunteers show up. We will have a lot of machinery there to do the heavy moving of dirt but extra help will get things done sooner.

SPECIAL NOTICE, READ CAREFULLY

We have noticed that some shooters on the outdoor range do not read the range rules. The most violated rule is SINGLE LOAD ONLY on the uncovered 50yd and the entire 100yd range. This means that only ONE round is allowed in the rifle at a time. This further means that you do not put a magazine in the rifle with more than one bullet in it. If you are caught shooting with multiple rounds in the rifle, an Incident

Report will be written, your range card will be shut off and you will be required to attend a meeting with the Range Safety Committee. This means that by the time this whole process takes place, you will be without range privileges for at least 3 months. There is no excuse to violate this rule. It is very easy to accidently discharge a second shot with a semi-automatic rifle with the recoil of the rifle, which could very likely go over the berm. Please review the range rules and don't let a suspension of your shooting privileges happen to you. There will be no more warnings given.

We are going to be gearing up for Christmas for our troops. This year we will be sending Christmas stockings and Christmas goodie bags. We have our work cut out for us because the need is great!



D.R. Wilson Rifle and Pistol Club & Action Pistol Range



There have been two work weekends in Phase 1 of the Range Improvement Plan that have made significant improvement to the general membership range. We now have a 10-yard range and the deteriorated backstops on the 25- and 50-yard ranges have been removed and replaced with earthen berms. Targets are now placed on horizontal rails and foam board backers and are lower which will prevent damage to the backstops. Stop by check it out and enjoy the new configuration! The third and next step in Phase 1 of the Range Improvement Plan is finishing the walls on the 10-, 25- and 50-yard berms, backfilling and elevating these berms to a greater height. This working session is scheduled for November 18/19. Come out and help if you can.

Range Safety Committee

With the improvements on the general membership outdoor range, please be aware there are new target

positions on the 10-, 25- and 50-yard ranges. Keep your targets centered on the foam backers that are attached to the horizontal rails. Keep your shooting (impact area) between the rails. Do not hang targets on the rails or above or below the rails. A lot of hard work has gone into the range improvement on these ranges and we need all to comply with this simple request to keep our ranges in good shape!

Lately there have been a number of people that have been found to be shooting in violation of our range rules on the general membership ranges. All members (and guests) that are using the ranges need to understand and comply with range rules. All members have been through the orientation and the rules are posted so there is no excuse for non-compliance. Remember members are responsible for their guests! Obey the rules or loose the privileges of range access as noted elsewhere and many times before.


Cost: \$5 Members, \$10 Non-Members

This is a "Fun-Shoot", for .22LR pistols, but, we will allow .22 LR (magazine fed.) rifles. Typical Equipment: Ruger Mark I, II, III, IV, 22/45; Hi Standard and other similar semi-auto pistols, and .22 Cal. Revolvers. Red Dot or Iron Sights.

Required: Eye and hearing protection.

Objective and course of fire: Clear the tables as quickly as possible. Range: 21 Ft. 6- tables per shooter per set. (Typically 2-3 sets per night.) Up to 4-shooters on the line. The longest time is thrown out, and the remaining 5 times are averaged for your score. The maximum time for a table is 15-seconds, cleared or not. Pins must be OFF the table, but not necessarily on the floor to stop the clock. Shooters start at a "Low Ready" position, waiting for the start buzzer. No magazine changes, but you are allowed to clear jams.

WATERFORD HILLS ROAD RACING (WHRRI) STICKY TIRES NEWS LETTER

My friend died last week. Jerry Pintar was good at what he did. Whether it was taking care of our facility or shooting at the Action Pistol Range, he exuded a quiet competence. He had a knack for knowing everyone. He was a consummate volunteer, whether at the racetrack or OCSC. He kept himself in pretty good shape, so his death was a shock to us all. As I look around our WHRRI and OCSC meetings, I can't help but notice that we have a high percentage of "mature adults" (myself included). Jerry's death can be a lesson to us all. He had been sick with a non-covid virus in mid-September. He felt better enough by race weekend 6 to be at the track. Sometime during the following week he felt exhausted. He missed the OCSC general meeting, something he would not normally do. The next day, having trouble catching his breath and feeling even more exhausted, he had his neighbor take him to an urgent care facility. They took one look at him and transferred him by ambulance to the hospital where he was quickly catheterized and had a stent placed. Unfortunately, the mild heart attack he was having and that he misdiagnosed as a recurrent virus went on long enough that he died two days later, his heart too damaged to function, never really regaining consciousness. I can't help but think that had he not had the initial virus he would have gone to the doctor when the symptoms started. I can't help but think that he would be at the track today rather than at the funeral home where we will go to say goodbye to him tomorrow. God speed my friend. It is hard to believe you are gone. We will miss you.

Our final race weekend went well. The Big Bore Bash and the Pursuit Race were exciting to watch. Everyone worked hard to make the weekend a success. We have been blessed with resurgence in the ranks of our volunteers. I hope we can continue it next year.

We are also blessed by a renewed interest in our Board of Director positions. Geoff Hegel, Adam Grzech, Greg O'Daniel and Tom Christen will be sworn in as new Board members at our October meeting.

For the first time in quite a few years we had a Volunteer Appreciation Day on October 1st. I think it was a great success despite the pall cast by the news of Jerry's passing. We had rides in racecars, games for the kids and plenty of good food. It was their day to have the racers cater to them rather than the other way around. I trust it will again become an annual event.

The banquet will be held on November 11th in the OCSC clubhouse. We are limited to 150 guests. Over 100 people have bought tickets already, so if you are planning on attending let Ron or Pam Krantz know soon. The Board voted to subsidize the banquet this year so tickets are only \$25.00. The cost will be substantially more at the door if there are any left.
