Bill of Rights Day is commemorated every year on December 15. The Bill of Rights consists of the first 10 amendments made to the United States Constitution, and its purpose is to spell out the personal freedoms and rights of the American people. The Bill of Rights was first written on September 25, 1789, and was later ratified on December 15, 1791, which is why Bill of Rights Day is celebrated on this date.

Bill of Rights Day was established by President Franklin D. Roosevelt who issued a Presidential Proclamation on November 1941, declaring that this holiday should be observed on December 15, and encouraging people to be patriotic on this day. The first Bill of Rights Day was commemorated on the 150th anniversary of the ratification of the document.

President Roosevelt believed that Bill of Rights Day was the most important day for freedom and all liberty-loving people. As the first Bill of Rights Day was observed during World War II, President Roosevelt also denounced Hitler and his party for taking away the individual freedoms of the people in his country.

In 1946 a request was made in Congress for Bill of Rights Day to be observed again, so President Harry Truman issued a proclamation for that purpose. It was only in 1962 that Bill of Rights Day became an annual observance, determined every year by a proclamation from the current serving President.





National Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day takes place on December 7. It commemorates the attack on Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, on December 7, 1941. The day is also known as Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day and Pearl Harbor Day. It also honors efforts made in the Pacific War (WWII) that followed the attacks.

On Sunday, December 7, 1941, just before 8 a.m., hundreds of Japanese fighter planes and submarines attacked the United States naval base of Pearl Harbor.

In just over an hour, the surprise attack destroyed or damaged more than 300 aircraft and 19 Navy ships, including 8 battleships. More than 2,400 navy personnel and civilians died and over 1,100 were injured.

President Franklin D Roosevelt called it "a date that will live in infamy," and declared war on Japan the following day, on December 8. Three days later, Japan's allies Germany and Italy declared war against the United States. Thus, the United States entered World War II.

Range Safety Committee

With the improvements on the general membership outdoor range, please be aware there are new target positions on the 10-, 25- and 50-yard ranges. Keep your targets centered on the foam backers that are attached to the horizontal rails. Keep your shooting (impact area) between the rails. Do not hang targets on the rails or above or below the rails. A lot of hard work has gone into the range improvement on these ranges and we need all to comply with this simple request to keep our ranges in good shape!

Lately there have been a number of people that have been found to be shooting in violation of our range rules on the general membership ranges. All members (and guests) that are using the ranges need to understand and comply with range rules. All members have been through the orientation and the rules are posted so there is no excuse for non-compliance. Remember members are responsible for their guests! Obey the rules or loose the privileges of range access as noted elsewhere and many times before.

Cost: \$5 Members, \$10 Non-Members

This is a "Fun-Shoot", for .22LR pistols, but, we will allow .22 LR (magazine fed.) rifles. Typical Equipment: Ruger Mark I, II, III, IV, 22/45; Hi Standard and other similar semi-auto pistols, and .22 Cal. Revolvers. Red Dot or Iron Sights.

Required: Eye and hearing protection.

Objective and course of fire: Clear the tables as quickly as possible. Range: 21 Ft.

6- tables per shooter per set. (Typically 2-3 sets per night.) Up to 4-shooters on the line.

The longest time is thrown out, and the remaining 5 times are averaged for your score.

The maximum time for a table is 15-seconds, cleared or not.

Pins must be OFF the table, but not necessarily on the floor to stop the clock.

Shooters start at a "Low Ready" position, waiting for the start buzzer.

No magazine changes, but you are allowed to clear jams.


I will soon be stepping away from my role as the Conservation Committee and MUCC representative. If you are interested in taking over this very rewarding position, please contact your executive board members or the office.
