Enjoy Free Fishing Weekend!

Two days twice a year, families and friends can enjoy one of Michigan's premier outdoor activities, Michigan Fishing, for FREE! The next Free Fishing Weekend dates are June 8 and 9, 2024. All fishing license fees will be waived for two days. Residents and out-of-state visitors may enjoy fishing on both inland and Great Lakes waters for all species of fish. <u>All fishing regulations will still</u> <u>apply.</u> A <u>Recreation Passport</u> will NOT be required for entry into state parks and boating access sites during Free Fishing Weekends. Check out a <u>fishing program at a state park</u>!

Free Fishing Weekend on June 8 and 9, 2024 is held in conjunction with "Three Free" weekend, where residents and nonresidents can grab a fishing rod, ride the off-road trails and visit state parks and boating access sites - all free of charge. During Free ORV Weekend, Michigan residents and visitors legally can ride without buying an ORV license or trail permit. All other ORV rules and laws still apply. Conservation Pledge

Michigan United Conservation Clubs adopted Outdoor Life's Conservation Pledge soon after it was created in 1946. A statewide contest was held in 1950 to present President Truman with a wood-carved copy of the Conservation Pledge. To this day, MUCC recites it before every meeting, as do we here at O.C.S.C. and at most of the MUCC affiliated local conservation clubs. It reminds us every day what conservation is all about. The Conservation Pledge is as relevant today as ever.



The Clan of the Wolf

As the trappers and explorers, that preceded us, the Clan of the Wolf members have the urge to explore and live off of the land. In the early 1990's a group of eight members began an annual pack-in and hunting trip that took us to the wilds of Kalkaska.

Our destination on the last weekend of September was more specifically the Sand Lake Quiet area. Once there, we stripped the vestiges of modern life, donned our wool, buckskins, and packs, then headed into the woods for the weekend.

Upon choosing our campsite by the lake, we erected our lean-to's and built our fires... (flint and steel of course). It was then time to scare up some meat for our bellies by dispatching squirrels, rabbit and such, with our trusty Trade Guns! Scattering in all directions, it was not long before our dinner of squirrel, jerky, dried corn, and some not so dry "corn" was consumed.

Settled in front of our fires after a long day, we smoked our pipes and recalled the day's events.
