Every year on **August 4** the United States Coast Guard celebrates its birthday. The U.S. Coast Guard was founded on this day in 1790 to provide coastal defense, enforce the payment of tariffs and trade laws, and stop smugglers from entering the country through the sea. Since 1790 its duties have only increased, but the Coast Guard keeps serving as safe-keepers of the United States' coast, making it the oldest continuous maritime service in the country.

Purple Heart Day, also known as National Purple Heart Day, Purple Heart Appreciation Day, and Purple Heart Recognition Day is commemorated every year on **August 7**. The Purple Heart Medal is a decoration awarded by the President of the United States to the soldiers of the U.S. military who were wounded or killed while serving their country, on or after April 5, 1917.

World Humanitarian Day is a United Nations holiday observed every year on **August 19**. It is a day to honor humanitarian personnel and recognize their efforts as aid workers during humanitarian world crises. It is also a day to remember those who lost their lives in humanitarian missions. This day's purpose is to raise awareness about the crucial humanitarian work that is happening around the world, and how important it is that all countries come together to assist those in need during harder times.

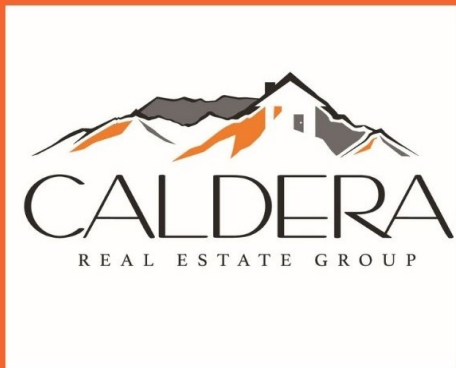

The D R Wilson Precision Pistol Team, led by team captain Ed Kretsch, again, sweeps the 2023-24 SEMPA awards, taking 10 out of 14 trophies and several other noteworthy awards.

SEMPA (Southeastern Michigan Pistol Assoc.) is the oldest pistol league in the United States. Today, it's comprised of 7 teams, and 91 active pistol shooters. The indoor league is an 8 month postal competition, comprised of 18 rimfire matches and 10 centerfire matches. It is shot from September to May each year. An Awards Banquet is held in May to recognize teams and shooters who have achieved top honors in several categories. Since 2019, D R Wilson has managed to out perform the other 6 teams in an extraordinary manner, winning multiple awards each year.

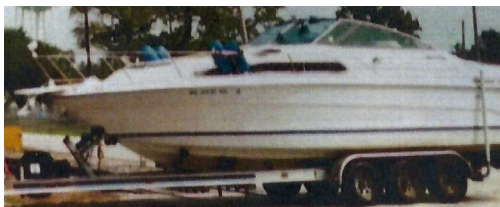
