Labor Day is celebrated On the first Monday of September every year, and it is a federal holiday in the United States. It started on Tuesday, September 5, 1882. It is an important date as The United States of America honors the American labor movement and pays tribute to the social and economic contribution of the laborers toward society and recognizes their individual rights. Labor Day falls at the end of the long weekend known as Labor Day weekend and also highlights the importance of fair employment practices and the ongoing struggle for labor equality. Labor Day weekend is a time for American workers to enjoy an extended break, engaging in various celebrations and activities and the start of the football season. Additionally, it signifies the end of summer and the transition to cooler weather.

The Autumnal Equinox, or the first day of fall in the Northern Hemisphere takes place very year on September 22nd or September 23rd.

In 2024, the Autumnal Equinox will take place on September 22, at 8:44am EST, and the season lasts for approximately 89 days and 20 hours till December 21st.

This day marks the moment when the sun is directly above the equator while moving from north to south, and also the astronomical beginning of fall in the Northern Hemisphere.

The outdoor match season on the APR is underway. .22 Cal., Half-Pins

Open to the Public!

Where: The O.C.S.C. Range House
4770 Waterford Road Clarkston, MI 48346

When: Sunday evenings, 6 PM to ~9 PM
Sept. 15 thru Dec. 15 (Skipping Nov. 24)
Feb. 16 thru May 18 (Skipping Apr. 20)

Cost: \$5 Members, \$10 Non-Members

This is a "Fun-Shoot", for .22LR pistols, but, we will allow .22 LR (magazine fed.) rifles.
Typical Equipment: Ruger Mark I, II, III, IV, 22/45; Hi Standard and other similar semi-auto pistols, and .22 Cal. Revolvers. Red Dot or Iron Sights.

Required: Eye and hearing protection.

Objective and course of fire: Clear the tables as quickly as possible. Range: 21 Ft.

6- tables per shooter per set. (Typically 2-3 sets per night.) Up to 4-shooters on the line.

The longest time is thrown out, and the remaining 5 times are averaged for your score.

The maximum time for a table is 15-seconds, cleared or not.

Pins must be OFF the table, but not necessarily on the floor to stop the clock.

Shooters start at a "Low Ready" position, waiting for the start buzzer.

No magazine changes, but you are allowed to clear jams.

Pin bottoms, tops, or full pins depending on caliber and your choice.

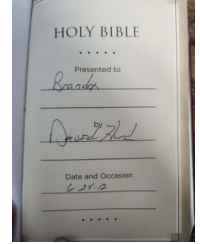
